

# REPRESENT

## COMPLEX COMMERCIAL

**Won a complete defense jury verdict in Kentucky** for a major auto parts manufacturer, ending a nine-year contract dispute that had been to the Sixth Circuit twice.

**Won a defense verdict in a \$28M breach of contract case** for a platinum-group-metals supplier.

**Tried a multimillion-dollar tax dispute** against a municipality for a nation-leading technology company. Verdict pending.

**Won a trial verdict for minority shareholders** in a closely held corporation to prohibit majority shareholders from interfering with WTO's clients' share and property rights.

**Won a multimillion-dollar arbitration award, including punitive damages,** for an investment fund misled into overpaying for an asset.

Won an arbitration award **worth more than 15 times the last settlement offer** for an energy company client.

**Recovered more than 90% of WTO's client's claim following arguments** in international arbitration for a global manufacturer.

**Won a Florida arbitration with zero liability for WTO's client,** a manufacturer of aerial lift and boom equipment, against multimillion-dollar damages claims.

**Won a preliminary injunction in a bet-the-company case** involving an oil and gas executive.

After 12 years of litigation, won a motion for a bifurcated trial, leading plaintiffs to **favorably settle billion-dollar claims** alleging WTO's client's electric facilities negatively affected dairy herd production.

Negotiated settlement for a manufacturer in bad faith claims against its insurer, **recovering three times the value of the multimillion-dollar policy** at issue.

Shielded a leading international manufacturer from multimillion-dollar exposure in third-party claims arising from power outages and **settled the case, after discovery, for just 1% of the amount claimed.**

**Won summary judgment enforcing Telephone Consumer Protection Act exclusions** and ruling that WTO's insurance company client owed no duty to defend an underlying class action as a matter of law.

Representing a leading telecommunications company in an indemnification action against an independent contractor based on **Fair Credit Reporting Act violations resulting in a class action lawsuit.**

## APPEALS

**Won Second Circuit affirmance of summary judgment** from the Southern District of New York favoring WTO's client, a Fortune Global 500 company, in a case involving fraud perpetrated by a former employee.

# LITIGATIONS

**Won unanimous Seventh Circuit victory in a fee dispute** for a leading appliance manufacturer. The case arose from a certified federal class action lawsuit that WTO settled after winning a defense verdict in the bellwether trial of related claims.

**Won Fourth Circuit reversal and remand** for a major manufacturer in an asbestos failure to warn case involving the government contractor defense.

**Argued a dealer dispute in the Sixth Circuit** for an automotive manufacturer. Opinion pending.

**Briefed and argued in the Tenth Circuit** in defense of a district court order that dismissed third-party intervenor's claims against WTO's client, a major U.S. railroad operator.

**Won reversal and remand from the Colorado Supreme Court** in a case that reestablishes the risk-benefit test as the appropriate test for juries to assess whether a product has been designed defectively.

**Won a rare reversal of certiorari from the Colorado Supreme Court** in a high-stakes dealer relocation dispute for an automaker.

**Won affirmance of WTO's trial court dismissal** of a wrongful termination suit involving the public policy exception to employment at will.

Drafted an amicus brief to the Tenth Circuit in a case involving the boundaries of a Native American reservation. The Court's opinion reflected WTO's arguments against potential **expansion of tribal court jurisdiction over hundreds of businesses and thousands of residents outside the reservation.**

## PROFESSIONAL LIABILITY

**Won a jury defense verdict in Philadelphia** for a hospital and physician assistant accused of failing to diagnose a leg infection that resulted in amputation. The jury agreed with WTO that, given the circumstances, the original diagnosis was reasonable.

**Won a complete defense verdict for a law firm and lawyer.** The jury found that, not only was WTO's client not negligent, the alleged negligence did not cause the claimed damages.


**Won a unanimous jury verdict in Kentucky defeating a \$55M malpractice claim** brought against WTO's hospital client.

**Won a complete defense verdict for a law firm and lawyer** accused of malpractice in handling the sale of interests in the plaintiff's company.

**Won a defense jury verdict in Ohio for two neonatologists** facing negligence claims in the care of a newborn baby.

**Won an arbitration for a law firm that sued its former client** for unpaid fees, ultimately securing those fees plus interest, as well as legal fees and costs incurred in the arbitration.

Called in three weeks before trial to defend a hospital in an 11-year-old wrongful death case, WTO **obtained favorable settlement just before closing arguments, including getting sanctions overturned.**

Obtained **Rule 12(b) dismissal of a \$500M lawsuit** against a large Midwestern law firm.

Obtained **nuisance value settlement of \$5M professional liability claims** against a New Mexico hospital.

## CLASS ACTION

Defeated **class certification in Ohio federal court** for a major appliance manufacturer amid allegations that more than two million ovens were prone to overheat. WTO disqualified the plaintiffs’ expert witness in a *Daubert* hearing and successfully argued the claims were overly broad.

Won **summary judgment in Colorado federal court** for a major insurer against class claims alleging that WTO’s client’s time limits on medical payments were illegal.

Representing a leading home products manufacturer against **federal class action claims in Illinois involving 15 million dishwashers**.

Representing a leading shipping company in a **New Mexico class action involving employment classification** claims.

Negotiated favorable settlement for a major manufacturer in **class action and other claims arising out of a catastrophic warehouse fire**.

Negotiated favorable settlement of **California wage and hour class action claims** for a security services firm.

## ANTITRUST & COMPETITION

Tried a **three-week antitrust and bid-rigging lawsuit as plaintiffs’ counsel** for two oil and gas companies. Ruling pending.

Representing **multiple defendants in \$2.1B federal antitrust litigation** involving the au pair program administered by the U.S. State Department.

Serving as **lead counsel for a New Mexico healthcare trade association in a federal antitrust action** alleging the association conspired to exclude healthcare providers from the market.

Despite defense claims that no U.S. court had ever enforced a covenant not to compete in this fashion, **won a preliminary injunction for a telecommunications company** to prevent a senior employee from joining a direct competitor.

Won dismissal of all claims, with prejudice and **without any payment by WTO’s financial institution client**, in trade secrets litigation involving over \$100M in alleged damages.

## EMPLOYMENT

Serving as **lead trial counsel in a high-stakes whistleblower case** involving a contractor providing security services for military installations in the Middle East.

REPRESENT

Obtained **dismissal with prejudice of whistleblower claims** against a hospital client in issues of first impression involving the Colorado Governmental Immunity Act.

**Won dismissal of whistleblower claims against a hospital** accused of denying treatment to patients, including a disabled veteran, based on disability and race.

Successfully **resolved age discrimination claims** against a leading national communications technology company.

## FRANCHISE & DISTRIBUTION

On remand, **affirmed a Texas trial victory for an automaker** in a dispute against a poorly performing dealer. In a supplemental decision, the judges cited exclusively to WTO's arguments and witness testimony.

Negotiated an enforceable stipulated order that **favorably resolved a car dealer termination dispute in California**, a state where it is notoriously difficult to terminate a dealer for poor sales performance.

Negotiated **creative settlement in Oregon for an auto manufacturer** seeking to establish a new dealership. The agreement allowed WTO's client to begin selling vehicles in less than six months, rather than the 18-24 months traditional litigation would have required.

## INSURANCE

After a contentious appeal, **won a complete defense jury verdict for a leading nationwide insurer** against a claim of negligent misrepresentation.

**Won reversal and remand of an adverse, seven-figure jury verdict** and affirmed sanctions against opposing counsel in third-party litigation for an insurer.

Won partial summary judgment and favorably settled a bad faith insurance lawsuit after **reducing the plaintiff's available damages by 90%**.

**Won a motion to dismiss an insurance appraiser's claim** that WTO's insurance company client committed libel per se. The Court ruled the defendant's statements were true as a matter of law.

## PRO BONO

In collaboration with the Rocky Mountain Immigrant Advocacy Network, **representing asylum seekers escaping severe domestic abuse** in their home countries.

Representing **a disabled Iraq War veteran and his spouse** in federal court in a foreclosure dispute against a loan servicer.

Representing **an indigent defendant in a Tenth Circuit appeal** contesting the dismissal of a Section 1983 dispute involving constitutional rights.

## 2017 HIGHLIGHTS

In 2017, 85% of WTO personnel donated time or funds to Foundation efforts.

**Denver Dumb Friends League** rescues, shelters, and adopts out injured, abused, and neglected animals. WTOF volunteers raised a record \$22,540 through multiple fundraisers and walked as a team with family, friends, and pets in the Furry Scurry.

**Legal Aid Foundation of Colorado** funds equal access to justice for low-income Coloradans facing civil legal problems. 100% of WTO's non-partner lawyers donated, contributing \$15,077 to the annual citywide law firm associates' campaign.

**The Denver Heart Walk** raises money on behalf of the American Heart Association to save lives from the country's #1 and #5 killers, heart disease and stroke. WTOF volunteers raised more than \$10,000 for the cause, and a team of 29 joined the nearly 1,000,000 who walked in over 300 Heart Walks across the U.S.

**Denver Public Schools Foundation** champions public education to help every child succeed. WTOF partnered with a Denver public elementary school to tutor first graders in reading. The program connects tutors and students through an online reading skills-building curriculum.

**The Gathering Place** is Denver's only daytime shelter for women, children, and transgender individuals experiencing homelessness and poverty. WTOF volunteers cooked and served hot breakfasts to more than 100 Gathering Place clients.

**Project C.U.R.E.** helps meet the need for medical supplies, equipment, and services around the world. WTO employees spent afternoons sorting unused medical supplies that were eventually sent to more than 130 countries.

**Metro Caring** operates one of the largest food pantries in Denver. WTO personnel donated \$3,785 to benefit Metro Caring in the Denver Bar Association's "Roll Out the Barrels" food drive.
