# **BIOGRAPHY**

Ashley Weaver's legal practice focuses on complex commercial litigation at both the trial and appellate level. Prior to joining WTO in 2013, she served as a litigation attorney at Ulmer & Berne LLP in Cleveland, Ohio where she represented clients ranging from individuals to Fortune 500 corporations in business and product liability litigation.

Ashley also previously served as a law clerk to The Honorable Patricia A. Gaughan of the United States District Court for the Northern District of Ohio. She also worked as a litigation attorney at the Boston law firm Foley Hoag LLP. Before attending law school, Ashley worked as a chemist at BFGoodrich and as a technical support engineer at MicroStrategy. She graduated *cum laude* from Georgetown University Law Center where she was a staff member and the online editor of the *Law and Policy in International Business Journal* and was selected as a Law Fellow to teach a first year legal research and writing section. She earned her undergraduate degree in Chemistry from Cornell University.

## **CASES**

- Won summary judgment in a medical malpractice case for a hospital and two physicians in New Mexico on plaintiffs' claims for "ordinary" negligence, negligence per se, breach of contract, and breach of express and implied warranty.
- Served as bellwether selection/coordination counsel and won summary judgment in a bellwether case for a cardiologist in Utah after more than 1,000 patients claimed our client's treatments were medically unnecessary.
- Won a motion to dismiss for a nurse and staffing agency sued under New Mexico's Wrongful Death Act amid emerging abortion law in the U.S. The court dismissed the plaintiff's claim with prejudice, agreeing with WTO's arguments and finding no cause of action existed under New Mexico law.
- Obtained summary judgment for a national legal malpractice carrier in an attorney-lien enforcement action in Wyoming district court. In this matter of first impression, the Court held that the plain language of the statute precluded the plaintiff law firm's attorney-lien and constructive fraud claims. As the prevailing party under the statute, WTO obtained a significant award of attorneys' fees and costs for its client.
- Won a unanimous defense verdict for Michelin following a three-week trial in Arizona state court in which the plaintiff demanded \$20 million in actual and punitive damages.
- Won a complete defense verdict and dismissal of punitive damages claims for a Wyoming hospital and codefendant physicians facing non-negotiable \$19 million negligence claims brought by a plaintiff who suffered a stroke

following emergency room treatment for a head wound.
